

Strike Out Hunger 10 years of Addressing Food Security

10 years ago, a group of volunteers reached out wanting to help a food pantry with sorting their shelves. After calling local pantries, UWGMC was informed that there was no food to sort since donations during the summer months become scarce. Since that summer, Strike Out Hunger (SOH), UWGMC's multi-pronged food security initiative, has united companies, individuals, and advocates in an effort to alleviate hunger in the lives of the 61,000+ local families struggling to make ends meet and put food on their tables. With the assistance of over 3,000 volunteers,



Strike Out Hunger has provided 806,000 meals through our signature Community Meal Packing event; distributed over 181,000 pounds of fresh produce; collected 12,000 pounds of non-perishable food; provided over \$203,000 in food grants allowing pantries to purchase ethnic/cultural foods, and delivered over 450 food pantry packages directly to home of those who have mobility issues. This year to ensure that local food pantry shelves are stocked with culturally relevant food items, UWGMC initiated 'Flavors of the Community' a guide to culturally relevant food items so people of all cultures have access to familiar foods, flavors and spices. SOH also includes accessing supplemental income that can be used for basic needs through our Free Tax Preparation program (VITA) and our Benefit Access program.
