Getting our Community College Ready

During the 2023-2024 school year, 238 college-bound students were served by the United Way of Greater Mercer County (UWGMC). UWGMC provided workshop facilitator-led sessions on college financial aid and scholarships, college admissions essay writing, mock interviews, and resume writing. We were able to serve students at Boys and Girls Club of Mercer County, Trenton Central High School-School Based Youth Services Program, Higher Up NJ, Urban Promise Trenton, Trio Upward Bound, Washington Crossing Boy Scouts, Jack and Jill of America Mercer County Chapter.

VITA Extended Tax Season - Appointments Available Now



It's never too late to file your taxes. The United Way of Greater Mercer County's VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) program offers free tax return preparation for families and individuals earning less than \$65,000. Trained and IRS-certified volunteers provide the service, including federal and state tax preparation.

The program has extended its tax season, offering appointments on Wednesday evenings during the summer and fall by appointment only. Appointments are held at 3444 Quakerbridge Rd, Bldg 3, Suite 101, Hamilton. For additional information or to make an appointment, call 609-896-1912. Availability is limited, and tax filing is not guaranteed.

Have SNAP Supplement Your Groceries:

UWGMC conducted outreach to over 1,200 individuals from July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024, filing nearly 280 applications to help them connect to NJ SNAP benefits and improve food access. UWGMC focused on reaching college students at The College of New Jersey and Mercer County Community College throughout the year to address the issue of students needing to be made aware or misinformed about their eligibility.



Additionally, UWGMC Resource Specialists are available at various locations, including Trenton Area Soup Kitchen, MECHA - Mercer County Hispanic Association, El Centro Catholic Charities, Center for Modern Aging Princeton, Princeton Human Services, and Princeton Public Library, to assist individuals in connecting to SNAP benefits.

We are asking you to help stock local food pantries for the summer! Your nonperishable donations will put food on their table for those needing it this summer. Purchase a grocery bag, fill it with nonperishable food items, and take it to your local food pantry.

To promote nutrition & healthy eating consider donating the suggested non-perishable food items:

- Canned tuna, chicken or salmon
- Beans (canned or dried)
- Split peas and lentils
- Whole grain pasta, brown rice, or Quinoa
- 100% fruit juice
- Cereal and oatmeal (whole grain or low sugar)
- Canned vegetables (low sodium or no salt)
- Applesauce (no sugar added)
- Peanut butter (18 oz plastic)
- Squeezable grape jelly
- · Shelf stable low-fat milk
- Olive & Canola Oils
- Vinegar or Lemon Juice

Call For Volunteers: VITA Tax Preparers and More



United Way of Greater Mercer County seeks volunteers to join its free tax program. This program offers tax return preparation assistance for families and individuals with an annual income of less than \$65,000. Volunteering in this program not only provides a sense of fulfillment and makes you feel good but also presents the opportunity to develop new skills and enhance your resume, which is particularly beneficial for students.

There are various roles, including Tax Preparer, Greeter, Site Coordinator, and Translator. Prior experience in tax preparation is not required, and volunteers can become IRS-certified with free training starting in the Fall of 2024. The volunteer commitment is flexible, with 3-4 hour shifts from February 1 to April 15, 2025. Financial professionals can earn continuing education credits, and college students can earn course credits. Volunteers must be at least 16 years old.
